
1. Keep the Summer Heat at a Minimum

With a screen enclosure, excessive heat and up to 70% of UV rays are kept out of your pool or patio area — making your pool area safer and more comfortable for you, your family, and your guests.

2. Boost Your Home's Value

In a study conducted by Redfin, homes with pools almost always sold at-or-higherthan the asking price — but pools without enclosures might not have that same ability. Screened patios have a similar effect, and it's safe to say that screen rooms and screened pool enclosures are a great way to improve your home's resale value. In addition to protecting you and your family, screen enclosures also:

- Add to the home's overall outdoor living space
- Enhance the visual appeal of the property.


FACTORS IN DETERMINING THE COST

As with any custom product, there are high-ends and low-ends to pool enclosure costs. The goal in providing potential buyers with a pool screen enclosure cost analysis is to help you determine what factors will have an impact on the type of pool enclosure you choose. FACTORS IN DETERMINING THE COST

The average cost of a pool screen enclosure — including design and materials — in Central Florida is between \$6,000 and \$8,000. This price is based on an 800 sq ft pool deck with a dome roof, and includes materials. This cost may fluctuate depending on custom designs, the size of the coverage space, or the terrain.



When you receive an estimate for your screen enclosure, the estimate will be broken down by labour and material costs — and will also include taxes and inspection fees required by the city and local building department. Some other common expenses include:

Dome Roof

One of the most common choices for pool and patio enclosures, the dome roof forms an open-air arch. The soft slope of the sides create a feeling of openness, making it a popular choice for homes in need of a little extra square footage and curb appeal. In addition to being architecturally striking, the dome roof pool enclosure is also more resistant to winds.


TYPES OF ROOF STYLES YOUR POOL ENCLOSURE

Gable Roof

A gable roof enclosure has two sloping sides that meet at the top in a triangle shape. Many Central Florida homeowners choose this roof shape because it mirrors the shape of the home, and can also stand alone to surround a pool or attach to an open patio. Gablestyle screen enclosures can also be two-stories — accommodating a wide array of needs of preferences.

Mansard Roof

The most popular style of screen enclosure for swimming pool owners, a mansard roof is flat at the top-center with a gradual slope toward the sides. One variation of the mansard roof, the hip roof, has similarly-sloping sides but a pointed top as opposed to a flat one. Both a mansard roof and a hip roof make the screen enclosure look taller and feel more spacious.

PREPARING YOUR BACKYARD FOR POOL ENCLOSURE INSTALLATION

After learning about the virtually-endless benefits of a screen enclosure, you're ready to begin the process of getting an enclosure of your own. Where do you start? Preparing your backyard for your pool enclosure installation. While this process will take a little time and effort, it is fairly easy to do! Follow these five steps for success.

1. Consult with a Screen Enclosure Professional

Safety should always be a priority, and it's important that you do your part to protect the people around you, your pets and your property. Notify your household and your neighbors about your new pool enclosure installation project and provide them with the information they need to stay safe. Make plans to keep small children and pets away from the work area during the installation. Move furnishings and breakables to a secure place outside of the construction zone. Construction is messy work, so you may want to consider

1. Choose the Right Time

Installing a screen enclosure takes time, and opting for an enclosure means resigning your backyard to being a construction zone for a while. For this reason: be sure not to schedule your installation for the weekend of your niece's birthday pool party or a patio dinner party you've been planning for months.

1. Clear the Way

Your installer will need room to work, so clear the way by:

- Clearing the work area of lawn decorations and patio furniture
- Trimming back any obstructive landscaping
- Ensuring that power outlets are accessible
- Setting security systems to allow entry to your property

4. Protect People, Pets, and Property.

Safety is a priority, and it is crucial that you do your part to keep people, pets, and property safe during the screen enclosure installation process. Keep your household and neighbors in the know, and provide them with the information they need to stay safe. Plan to keep children and pets away from the work area during the installation, and move furniture and breakable items away from the construction zone.

5. Communicate Effectively

Almost any issue can be solved with proper communication, so be sure to keep in touch with Florida Pool Enclosures through the installation process. Even something as simple as being accessible in the event of an unexpected occurrence can make the installation process smoother.



HOW LONG DOES IT TAKE TO BUILD A POOL ENCLOSURE

While there are many factors that can influence a project's timeline, we can analyze each step in the screen enclosure building process to get a sense of what to expect — and how long it might take to complete a project. There are three steps in particular which can lengthen a project's completion time.

1. Getting HOA Approval

Those living in a community with a Homeowners Association (HOA) may be required to obtain proper approval before installing a screen enclosure. Florida Pool Enclosures will help you with all the necessary paperwork, but how long approval will take depends on the HOA. Our advice: ask your HOA about their approval process in advance to know what to expect!

2. Navigating Around Landscaping

Existing landscaping beds in close proximity to the pool or patio area may interfere with the construction of your screen enclosure, as will sprinkler heads or irrigation systems. To preserve your landscaping and prevent any damage to your irrigation system, it is wise to contact your landscaping company to have them properly relocated/protected.

3. Securing Proper Permitting

Florida Pool Enclosures will assist in getting proper permits for your new screen enclosure, but we have no control over the permitting process. There are many variables that can influence processing time — including the county you live in and the number of permit requests that are being submitted — and the process can take up to a month in some cases. For many homeowners this is the lengthiest step in the process, but good things come to those who wait.

STEER CLEAR

Some homeowners may have a difficult time finding the right screen enclosure installation company, so we've put together a list of red flags to keep an eye out for — which may save you time, money, and frustration in the future.

Look for Proper Licensing and Insurance

While unlicensed contractors may try and sweeten the deal with reduced rates and quick turnaround times, the risk is never worth it. Florida Pool Enclosures is fully-licensed, and with dealing with any other installation company: be sure to verify their licensure using the Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation (DBPR) database.

Beware Pressure to Sign

A good contractor will accept a signed contract on your time — and if a screen enclosure contractor is rushing you into signing a contract, there's a possibility they might not be trustworthy.

Look Out for "Low Prices"

Contractors who boast a "low" price relative to their competitors may be trying to compensate for a low-quality product. An honest contractor offers competitive prices for high-quality results, and will never try to lure you into business by dramatically undercutting the market.

Look for Missing Details

A reputable screen enclosure installer like Florida Pool Enclosures should be able to provide you with a detailed contract covering:

- The exact screen enclosure cost
- Warrantied items
- An agreed-upon set of plans and outline
- A copy of the installer's insurance and license

If the installer can't provide these details, there could be something they are hiding

so steer clear!
